Steps in Making a Club Decision

2. _____ - someone from the group must agree to the motion.
3. _____ - all members of the group must do this, addressing the pros, cons, etc. of the original motion.
4. _____ - the president will say this before the group votes.
5. _____ - the group will do this to voice their opinion of the motion at hand.
